The Centre for Innovation In Peer Support (embedded in Support & Housing-Halton), Stephanie Rattelade (Stella's Place), The Centre for Excellence in Peer Support (embedded in CMHA Waterloo Wellington), Robyn Priest (Robyn Priest Live Your Truth) and Simon Coulombe (Wilfrid Laurier University) came together after the conference to organize how we could help to make this happen. The Centre for Innovation in Peer Support and Simon Coulombe (Wilfrid Laurier University) and Robyn Priest (Robyn Priest Live Your Truth) have offered to lead the ongoing development of this CoP. Our goal is to better connect and facilitate the work of peer support researchers in Canada and elsewhere.
